Shortlist for filing of a Trademark Application in Argentina

<p>Argentina</p> 	<p>The following is a shortlist which shows the steps that need to be followed when filing a trademark application in Argentina.</p> <p>By following this shortlist we intend to make your experience of filing a trademark application in Argentina easier.</p> <p>Of course we will be informing you what needs to be done along the whole process in our correspondence.</p> <p>Should you have any comments or doubts please feel free to contact us.</p>
<p>Information and documents needed for filing initially</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Description of goods or services • TM to be filed and design if any • Applicant's details • Priority details if applicable • When renewing a TM a declaration of use is necessary. No notarization or legalization is needed (a 90 day term extension may be requested)
<p>Within 40 working days</p>	<p>Power of Attorney form (Form 1) duly notarized and legalized by means of the Apostille or up to the nearest Argentine Consulate.</p>
<p>Within 90 running days</p>	<p>Certified Copies of the Priority document and Certified Spanish translations of same.</p>
<p>Publication</p>	<p>Will take place within approx. 2 months counted as from the filing date.</p>
<p>Opposition Period</p>	<p>The publication opens a 30 running day opposition period for third parties to file oppositions against the published application. This term is non-extendable.</p>
<p>Examination by the PTO</p>	<p>Will be conducted in approx. 4 to 6 months counted as from the filing date.</p>
